I love teaching Kindergarten and watching my students' eyes light up when they start to make connections, begin to read, or grasp math concepts. I love seeing the creativity they bring to art projects, building toys, and the dramatic play area. I look forward to sharing these experiences with your child.

Parents often wonder if their child is ready for Kindergarten. Here are some of the skills I consider important for a successful Kindergarten year:

Your child is able to

- verbalize his/her wants and needs
- follow single and multi step instructions
- wait their turn
- regulate their emotions
- recognize and write their first name
- get themselves dressed
- be independent in the bathroom
- use scissors, glue, crayons and a pencil
- recite the alphabet
- identify most capital letters
- count to 10
- recognize numbers 1-5

Over the summer, I recommend that you read to your child daily, go outside explore, draw a picture and write about these experiences. Collect small objects, sort and count the objects. Practice opening a juice box, a thermos, and a lunch box is always helpful.
