What is CSF?

- CSF is a national organization with a network of <u>partner programs</u>, each providing scholarships that empower parents to choose schools they otherwise could not afford.
- Since its inception in 1998, CSF has awarded more than \$885 million in scholarships to the families of 185,000 low-income children.
- CSF has been awarding education tax credit scholarships in NH since 2013.





Education Tax Credit Scholarships

ETC is the **Education Tax Credit** (ETC) Scholarship Program where money is donated by individuals and businesses to fund scholarships.

- Scholarships average \$2,600
- They can be used for tuition or homeschool expenses.
- They are targeted to children leaving public school.
- Scholarships are paid directly to schools in a Fall and Spring payment.
- A child can get both an ETC and an EFA, if ETC funds are available.





Education Freedom Accounts



Education Freedom Accounts
(EFA) are grants from the State
of New Hampshire administered
by Children's Scholarship Fund
(CSF). They are the same dollars
that are available to traditional
public-school students but now
they are now available to
families for certain educational
expenses. The base grant is
approx. \$3,400 per student.

Applications are rolling. Apply by July for a full EFA for the upcoming school year, or apply through February for a pro-rated EFA for the current school year.	✓

No Cost or Fees

- There are no application fees for parents or schools / education providers.
- In EFA, ClassWallet transactions are subject to a 2.5% processing fee; however, CSF pays the cost of this fee directly from the administrative portion of an EFA grant so there is no cost to providers and no additional cost to families.

Eligibility

- Children, and their families, must be New Hampshire resident/s.
- Household income must be at or below 300 percent of the federal poverty guidelines.
- In EFA, ANY child who is eligible to enroll in a public elementary or secondary school, which is every NH child that meets the income limits.
- In ETC, scholarships are targeted to children leaving public school or entering Kindergarten or 1st grade.
- For students entering Kindergarten, the child must be 5 years old by September 30th.

What Documentation is Needed to Verify Eligibility?

- Tax Returns
- Business Income from Self Employment
- Child Support / Alimony
- Public Assistance Cash / Food Stamps Income (SNAP)
- Social Security Untaxed Income
- Unemployment / Worker's Compensation
- Other Financial Sources



EFA Differentiated Aid Qualifications

On top of the base EFA grant of \$3,400, differentiated aid provides additional EFA funding for certain individual factors.

- Free or Reduced Lunch Income Level Grant Verified via Family Financial Qualification
- English Language Learners Grant Verified via School District Letter or DOE
- 3rd Grade Proficiency Grant Verified via DOE NH Statewide Assessment Data
- Students with Qualifying Disabilities Verified via IEP or Signed Medical Certification Form

- You can apply for an ETC Scholarship or an EFA or both
- If you prefer to do the application in a language other than English, you can select your preferred language.
- Please submit <u>only one (1)</u> application per family. Submitting multiple applications may delay processing times.
- Please have your household income documents ready and in PDF format.

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Application Deadlines

Annual ETC application deadline: May 5th, 2023

Rolling EFA application VERIFICATION deadline: (for 100% access) July 17th, 2023

*Have EFA Application in 8-10 weeks prior to verification due date



EFA NHDOE Verification



Once a parent has completed an application and a student is found eligible for EFA by CSF, parents will be notified via email. Prior to funding of EFA, the NHDOE will cross-check the eligible student. Funding will not be released until the eligible student is verified by the NHDOE and the grant funds are remitted to CSF.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis; however, for applications that are completed after July 15 in any year, the EFA grant will be partial and prorated. Applications received after February 1 will be for the next school year.



EFA Grant Schedule

- The annual amount of the Education Freedom Account (EFA) awards are prorated based on the following application completion deadlines.
- Applications completed and verified by July 15 = 100% award.
- Applications completed and verified by September 15 = 80% award.
- Applications completed and verified by November 15 = 60% award.
- Applications completed and verified by February 1 = 30% award.



EFA Grant Distribution

- The State of New Hampshire will disburse funds to the scholarship organization for the eligible student's EFA account 4 times during the state fiscal year in every future year.
- Applications that were completed and verified by July 15, 2022 = 100% annual grant, 20% in September
- Applications completed and verified by Sept 15, 2022 = 80% annual grant, 20% in November
- Applications completed and verified by November 15, 2022 = 60% annual grant, 30% in January
- Applications completed and verified by February 1, 2023 = 30% annual grant, 30% in April



Allowable Use Categories for EFA Funds

- Tuition and fees at a private school.
- Tuition and fees for non-public / private online learning programs.
- Tutoring services
- Services provided by a district public school, chartered public school, public academy, or independent school
- Textbooks, curriculum, or other instructional materials.
- Computer hardware or other technological services and devices. (max 1 computer every 3 years)
- Educational software and applications.

• School uniforms.



Allowable Use Categories for EFA Funds

- Fees for nationally standardized assessments, advanced placement examinations, examinations related to college or university admission or awarding of credits and tuition and/or fees for preparatory courses for such exams.
- Tuition and fees for summer education programs and specialized education programs. (ie: Manchester Community Music School.. anything conducted in a building/institution... Ex. Latitude Learning, Karate Schools)
- Tuition and fees at a career or technical school and related instructional materials. (Trade schools like EMT, Carpentry, Electrician, Plumber, etc...)
- Educational services and therapies, including, but not limited to, occupational, behavioral, physical, speech-language, and audiology therapies.
- Tuition and fees at an institution of higher education.
- Fees for transportation paid to a fee-for-service transportation provider for the student to travel directly to and from an approved education service provider.



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Children's Scholarship Fun

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Record of Educational Attainment

The EFA law requires that all students renewing the EFA grant <u>must</u> provide a record of educational attainment. Below are the three acceptable forms of a qualified record of educational attainment. Returning EFA students must submit one:

A Standardized Test

Acceptable standardized tests include, but are not limited to:

- California Achievement Test
 NWEA/MAP
- CLT (Classical Learning Test)
- ERB Milestone
- ERB CTP
- Iowa Test of Basic Skills
- SAT
 Standford Achievement Test
- Terra Nova

If you do not see your standardized test, select '*Other*' on the application.

You will need to enter the Total score, the Math score, and the ELA score. You will be asked to

PSAT

upload the report to the student's application.

2. The NH state-wide assessment

You will need to enter the **Total score**, the **Math score**, and the **ELA score** of the state-wide assessment. You will be asked to upload the report to the student's application.

A signed evaluation letter from a teacher of the student's portfolio of work from the 2022-2023 school year

The evaluation letter must include the following:

- (1) The name and address of the teacher, including state recognized documentation of certification or the name and address of the nonpublic school in which the teacher is currently teaching;
- (2) The date(s) on which the evaluation(s) took place;
- (3) A description of the work reviewed;
- (4) A summary of the child's educational progress; concluding with a statement that the child has or has not made educational progress; and
- (5) The signature of the teacher

You will be asked to upload the report to the student's application.

EFA Digital Wallet

- EFA grant funds may be accessed by families through a digital wallet and payment platform, with oversight by the scholarship organization.
- The digital wallet platform allows parents and guardians to upload invoices for tuition and fees directly to the payment platform for processing.
- It also allows parents and guardians to purchase materials necessary for the eligible student's education directly from a marketplace of online vendors.
